73.7% (45,800) of the total labour force in Kingston is represented in 7 of 20 industry groups. Ontario has 57.5% of its total labour force in the same industries. Health care and social services has the highest share of the labour force in Kingston at 16.4% compared to Ontario at 10.8%.

POPULATION FACTS

In 2016, the population of Kingston was 123,798 an increase of 0.4% or 435 people since the 2011 census. In comparison, the province of Ontario had an increase in population of 4.6% or 596,673 people.

66.0% of Kingston's population is aged 15 – 64 compared to 66.8% for Ontario.

19.4% of Kingston's population is 65 years and older compared to 16.7% for Ontario.

The median age for Kingston is 41.9 and the median age for Ontario is 41.3.

This data indicates that Kingston has a slightly older workforce and population than Ontario. It also shows that Kingston experienced a stagnant growth in population.

INCOME

Kingston has a higher median total income than Ontario. Males in both Kingston and Ontario have significantly higher incomes than females. Kingston reports higher incomes for both males and females compared with males and females in Ontario.

The occupational category of Sales and service occupations represent 26.3% of the labour force in Kingston. This compares to 23.4% in Ontario. Sales and service occupations is the number one occupational category for Kingston and Ontario.
