Comparing educational attainment for the working age population 25 - 64, Elizabethtown-Kitley has a significantly higher ratio for persons with a college education than Ontario. But has a lower rate of university level education at a bachelor level and above.

TOP 7 INDUSTRIES REPRESENTING THE TOTAL LABOUR FORCE

66.1% (3350) of the total labour force in Elizabethtown-Kitley is represented in 7 of 20 industry groups. Ontario has 52.6% of its total labour force in the same industries. Health care and social services has the highest share of the labour force in Elizabethtown-Kitley at 14.3% compared to Ontario at 10.8%.

POPULATION FACTS

In 2016, the population of Elizabethtown-Kitley was 9,854 an increase of 1.3% or 130 people since the 2011 census. In comparison, the province of Ontario had an increase in population of 4.6% or 596,673 people.

63.9% of Elizabethtown-Kitley's population is aged 15 - 64 compared to 66.8% for Ontario.

22.9% of Elizabethtown-Kitley's population is 65 years and older compared to 16.7% for Ontario.

The median age for Elizabethtown-Kitley is 49.9 and the median age for Ontario is 41.3.

This data indicates that Elizabethtown-Kitley has an older workforce and population than Ontario. It also shows that Elizabethtown-Kitley has a healthy growth in population.

INCOME

Elizabethtown-Kitley has a higher median total income than Ontario. Males in both Elizabethtown-Kitley and Ontario have significantly higher incomes than females. Elizabethtown-Kitley reports higher income for both males and females compared to Ontario.

75.5% of the population of Elizabethtown-Kitley resided at the same address over the last 5 years compared to 62.9% for Ontario. Elizabethtown-Kitley reported a significantly lower migration rate of persons from other countries than Ontario.
